## OUR PRODUCT

We manufacture NORTHERN BLEACHED SOFTWOOD KRAFT (NBSK) pulp. With one fibre line producing 327,000 air-dried metric tons annually, our high-quality product is used in the manufacturing of a variety of consumer products including premium paper towel, tissue products and specialty grade papers.





Our operations are located in the heart of the Boreal Forest in Northwestern Ontario. The forests that support our facility provide us with approximately 1.9 million cubic meters of wood fibre annually. We follow a rigorous forest management planning process which is overseen by the province of Ontario. Dryden Fibre Canada is licensed to manage two Sustainable Forest License (SFL) areas; the Trout Lake and Wabigoon Forests and we are certified to third party standards to verify that the product we produce in Dryden comes from sustainable and well managed forests. The fact we have been doing this for over 100 years demonstrates our success and our commitment to sustainability.

Our engagement work also focuses efforts to foster public understanding of the positive impact of the forest sector and sustainable forest management.


